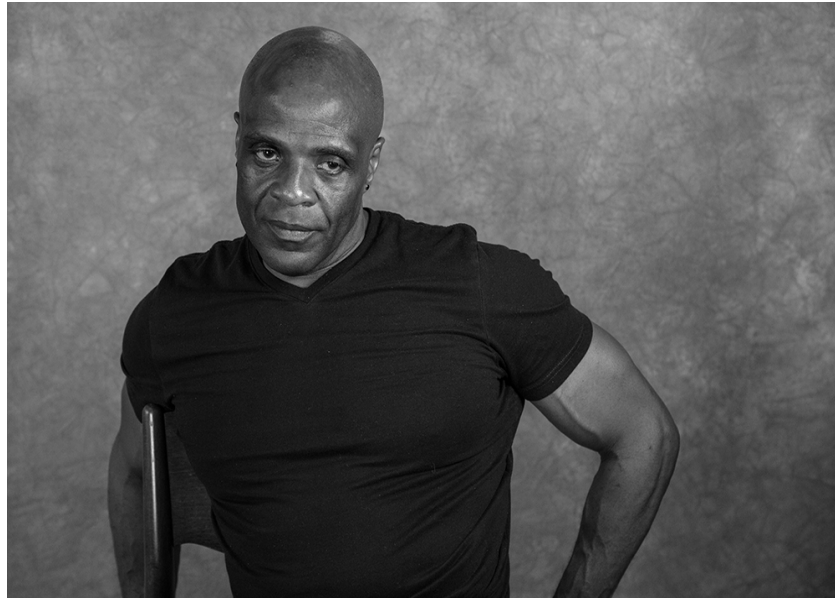




# Poetry Reading
